A Chat with Dr. Tom ...

This month I would like to introduce you to *Aman Cara*, a book by John O'Donohue. This wisdom was brought to my attention by Mary Elva Smith, who for two years was the Interim executive Presbyter of the Presbytery of Sacramento. For a short time, before she moved to Louisville, KY, Mary Elva functioned as my spiritual director.

What, you may ask, is a spiritual director? Such a person enters into your life by your invitation to help guide you in your spiritual life. Spiritual Directors are trained in this discipline. I know several locally, including my wife Kathy. There is a training center in Sacramento called *The Bread of Life Center* (www.breadoflife.org). A spiritual director comes alongside to help in your spiritual walk with God. Not a psychotherapist -- not someone to talk to about emotional problems per se, though you might mention, for instance, that you can't seem to focus on God because of other stuff in your life. The goal of the spiritual director is to help get you re-focused on getting closer to Jesus. People usually meet with a Spiritual Director once a month, and though there is usually a negotiated cost, it is usually not very much.

From the beginning of O'Donohue's book: "In the Celtic tradition, there is a beautiful understanding of love and friendship. One of the fascinating ideas here is the idea of soul-love; the old Gaelic term for this is aman cara. Anam is the Gaelic word for soul and cara is the word for friend. So anam cara in the Celtic world was the 'soul friend.' In the early Celtic church, a person who acted as a teacher, companion, or spiritual guide was called an *anam cara*. It originally referred to someone to whom you confessed, revealing the hidden intimacies of your life. With the aman cara you could share your innermost self, your mind and your heart. This friendship was an act of recognition and belonging. When you have an aman cara, your friendship cut across all convention, morality, and category, You were joined in an ancient and eternal way with the 'friend of your soul.' The Celtic understanding did not set limitations on space or time on the soul. There is no cage for the soul. The soul is a divine light that flows into you and into your Other. This art of belonging awakened and fostered a deep and special companionship. In everyone's life there is great need for an aman cara. In this love, you are understood as you are without mask or pretension. The superficial and functional lies and half-truths of social acquaintance fall away, you can be as you really are. Love allows understanding to dawn, and understanding is precious. When you are understood, you are home."

As with O'Donohue, and with Mary Elva, I believe that friendship is the nature of God. The Christian concept of god as Trinity is the most sublime articulation of otherness and intimacy, an "eternal interflow of friendship." This is what Jesus had in mind when he said, 'Behold, I call you friends.' In friendship with Jesus, we enter the tender beauty and affection of the Trinity. In the embrace of this eternal friendship, we dare to be free. O'Donohue quotes a Celtic invocation:

The Sacred Three My fortress be

Encircling me Come and be round My hearth and my home.

Thus, love is anything but sentimental. In fact, it is the most real and creative form of human presence. Love is the threshold where divine and human presence ebb and flow into each other.

If you are ready to move deeper into your walk with Jesus, you may be ready to form a relationship with a Spiritual Director. I have always found to be true this ancient phrase: 'When the student is ready, the teacher appears."

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

At the regular meeting of Session on March 20, 2012, the following reports were heard and actions taken:

- Heard a report from Rob Armijo, who attended Presbytery as a commissioner, that Anna Perrine was elected as a commissioner to General Assembly.
- Approved establishing a limited term fund designed to pay for travel expenses and other costs of candidates under final consideration by our PNC.
- Approved hosting a 60 minute workshop to teach older adults how to avoid becoming a victim of identity theft, mail fraud, check scams, foreign lotteries and telephone solicitations.
- Approved submitting volunteer job opportunity bulletins to River City High School to solicit high school students for volunteer opportunities at Trinity including, but not limited to community outreach events, church cleanup, etc
- Approved contracting with Collins Electric Co. to complete needed repairs to the church electrical system.

2nd Sunday (+ One) !!! Family Games April 15, 5:00-7:00 pm



COMING SOON: Scam Alert Workshop for Seniors

The Yolo County District Attorney Elder Protection Unit will be hosting a workshop at Trinity Presbyterian Church early May 2012. The workshop will identify how older adults can protect themselves against crimes such as identity theft, telemarketing fraud, door-to-door and phony check/lottery scams. According to the FBI Identity Theft is now one of the fastest growing crimes in the Country and citizens may not even know they are a victim until creditors start calling.

Since fraud schemes are ever evolving, continuing education is essential to reduce the number of potential victims. Fortunately, awareness is a very effective tool in combating these types of crimes. The District Attorney's office believes that teaching older adults how to recognize and avoid these scams is an effective tool to combat crime. You will learn simple and practical ways to help reduce your exposure to things like check fraud, skimming and home invasion robbery.

Money Matters: Per Capita

Perhaps one of the most confusing aspects of how the Presbyterian Church functions is "per-capita". Each year our church encourages its members to pay their per-capita apportionment. Why do we do this? Where does this money go?

One of the great strengths of our denomination is that it is so inter-connected. Trinity is tied to the larger church in ministry. One form of that connection is through our per-capita. Every Presbyterian church in the country is required to pay a certain amount for each active member on its rolls. This money goes to support the work and ministry of our church throughout the country. Each governing body above our Session has staff members and expenses that support the work of the church. These individuals have no congregation to support their ministry, but they are essential to the life of the Presbyterian Church.

This year Trinity's per-capita apportionment is **\$22.25** per member, which is split for the work of our General Assembly (\$6.63), the Synod of the Pacific (\$5.22), Presbytery of Sacramento (\$9.40), and the Presbytery's New Church Development Fund (\$1.00).

Many people have the misperception that per-capita is their annual "Presbyterian membership dues". Not true. Our church isn't a fraternal or service organization that will dismiss members for unpaid dues. Yes, Trinity is required to pay its percapita to the large church. This year's total is \$4,205.25. If members are unwilling or unable to pay, then the money will be taken out of our operating budget to complete our per-capita obligation. This has a negative financial impact on other church programs.

If you haven't done so already, please make out a check payable to Trinity Presbyterian Church in the amount of \$22.25 (\$25.00 if the spirit moves you) for each active church member in your household. Make a note on your check that it is to be used for per capita. Mail your check to the church office or simply put it in the offering plate on Sunday.

Update from your Pastor Nominating Committee

The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) has met seven times since being formed at the Congregational Meeting at the end of January. In this short amount of time using prayer, study, the information from the Holy Cow Survey and the Unlocking the Code process, the PNC was able to complete the Church Information Form.

A key summary statement from Trinity's CIF is: "We take Christ's leadership and call to service seriously. Our congregation reflects a broad age, class, ethnic, and cultural range, and we enjoy spending time with each other and supporting one another in Christ. Our leadership mirrors our congregation with a range of seasoned and new Christians willing to work together. We pray fervently, as individuals and as a body, for our church and for those whom we serve. We are firm in our beliefs yet respectful of those whose beliefs differ from ours. Trinity is a congregation truly interested in seeking God's will."

Thursday March 22 the PNC presented their work to the presbytery's Committee On Ministry (COM). The COM approved Trinity's Church Information Form, the same day, and authorized the PNC to upload the information on the PC(USA) Church Leadership Connection (CLC) website. CLC connects congregations, presbyteries, synods, educational institutions and other Presbyterian entities seeking leaders for ministry positions with pastors, Christian educators, administrators, executives and other church professionals seeking a call to service within the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Jessie Schlunegger is actively putting our CIF for a new pastor for Trinity on the website. In a few days you will be able to go to:

If you search for California and then go the Sacramento Presbytery the complete CIF will be there. You can also call the office and ask for a copy.

The PNC will continue to pray and work to find the pastor God has already prepared for Trinity. In April we will begin to review and interview candidates.

Seeing Fruit

As some of you may know, Dan and I are feeling God leading us away from Trinity. We had been praying and fasting about this for a long time, and felt God confirm it in December. We announced it to the youth group in January, which was even more difficult for us than we expected. Because of the church's financial situation, we told them we weren't sure if the position would be replaced.

A couple weeks after our announcement, a group of student leaders approached us with a proposal. They said this church is their family; it is where they have met God and where their closest friends are. They told us about the essential role the youth group has played in their lives and that they didn't want it to end. These 16 and 17 year old teens told us they wanted to continue the group with student leaders.

The teens had written out what would need to happen in order to make this happen. We told them we really didn't know what would happen, but they could try to lead themselves while we are still there.

The next week we watched the youth run themselves. We had been equipping them for this for a while, occasionally having a youth run the game or give a message, but now they were motivated to do it all. Austin gave the message on spiritual gifts, challenging each individual to help with the gifts God has given them. Ben and Jasmine ran an awesome game involving gum and whipped cream pies. The next week Katie McNeilly and Katie Magana gave a message on coping with grief, Alex ran a super bowl trivia game, Austin led worship, and they spent time praying for one another. They have also led a discussion on coping with depression, dealing with anger, and Christian Barret gave a message on the Good Samaritan. One student leader told me her bible is marked up and highlighted now.

I share this because watching them lead themselves has refreshed me. It has made me excited about the big difference this church has made in their lives. We are seeing so much fruit from God's ministry with these amazing teenagers. It's been one of the most beautiful things I have ever seen. Many teens have been afraid to pray out loud, but are now willing and eager. I want to invite you to come and observe on a Wednesday night. I am sure you will be ministered to on your visit. I also want to challenge you to pray and see if there is a way God wants you to be involved. Could you come once a month on a Wednesday night to help supervise? Could you mentor a teenager? They are certainly growing in their spiritual maturity and can lead themselves in many ways, but they need adult support. Can you commit to praying for these student leaders? I am not sure what God is going to do through all of this, but I am excited
