ARE YOU A CRACKED POT?

"Therefore if anyone cleanses himself from the latter, he will be a vessel for honor, sanctified and useful for the Mas ter, prepared for every good work." ~ 2 Timothy 2:21

Do you ever feel that you don't have much to give? Maybe something in your past is holding you back from exploring your future? Perhaps you don't think your offering makes as much a difference as the next person. Be careful of comparing yourselves to others, versus focusing on how God can use you. Take, for example, the story of the cracked pot.

... A water bearer had two large pots. One hung on each end of a pole, which he carried across his neck. One of the pots had a crack in it, but the other pot was perfect and always delivered a full portion of water at the end of the long walk from the stream to the master's house, while the cracked pot arrived only half full.

For a full two years this went on daily, with the bearer delivering only one-and-a-half pots full of water to his master's house. The poor cracked pot was very ashamed of its imperfection and was miserable that it could only do half of what it had been made to do -- or so it thought.

The cracked pot, after two years of what it perceived to be a bitter failure, spoke to the water bearer one day by the stream. "I am very ashamed of myself, and I want to apologize to you."

"Why?" asked the water bearer. "What are you ashamed of?"

"For the past two years, I have only been able to deliver half of my real capacity, because this crack in my side allows water to leak out all the way back to the master's house. Because of my flaws, you have to do all of this work, and you don't get full value from your efforts," the cracked pot said.

The bearer said to the pot, "Did you notice that there were flowers only on your side of the path, but not on the other pot's side? That's because I have always known about your flaw and put it to good use. I planted flower seeds on your side of the path (for the return trip), and every day while we walk back from the stream, you've watered them. For ove two years I have been able to pick these beautiful flowers to decorate my master's table. If you weren't the way you ar he wouldn't have flowers for his house..."

We are all cracked pots. If we give God all of ourselves, cracks and all, he will use us, including our flaws, to do his will. It's not about being perfect. And it's not about comparing ourselves to others. It's about letting God use us just as we are and experiencing the joy of what can happen when we give ourselves to him.

Are you willing to give yourself to God...cracks and all?

- Heard a report from Finance that we are spending more every

month than we are taking in.

- Approved reducing the amount given to Presbytery Mission and to eliminate the amount given to overseas mission.
- Approved the use of Crowd Funding under certain guidelines.
- Approved moving the April Session meeting to April 28th.
- Heard a report that the 9 am worship service will become fully contemporary and the 10:30 am worship service will become fully traditional after Easter.
- Approved setting up a Textto-Giving account which allows for giving through a text.
- Heard a report from the presbytery commissioners.

 Approved receiving the One Great Hour of Sharing on Palm Sunday.

In a time of transition, when everyone is missing Pastora Tina, the Leadership Team is really stepping up and taking charge of this ministry. Confidence is building. Lina Jimenez prepares the agendas for the Team Leader meetings. Leaders rotate moderating the meetings. Each leader reports on their area of responsibility, and issues that needed addressing are addressed.

The ministry celebrates that at the Joint Bilingual Congregational Meeting January 25, Lina Jimenez and Marielena Olivares were elected as Deacons. They were installed on Sunday, February 8. As Deacons, they will serve the families of the Latino Ministry.

Sunday, February 15, the Ministry celebrated Valentine's Day with a meal of posole and flan. People were asked to share with the group how they met, and about their wedding and family. A very good time was had by all. Everyone learned something new.

Birthdays and anniversaries are celebrated the first Sunday of each month. Three youth: Javier Jr., Christian and Santiago attended the Presbytery All-Night Youth Event in Rocklin. Their favorite activity was playing soccer in the dark. They report that the food was good, too! Youth are being invited to join the Trinity Summer Mission Trip.

Rev. Carmen Rosales of San Francisco Presbytery preached on Sunday, March 15, and people appreciated her sermon and presence. Arturo is preaching a sermon series on the other three Sundays each month. The Praise Team is getting stronger, and Santiago has joined them.

Holy Week activities are being coordinated with the English Ministry.

Javier is working with Robb Perrine to fine tune the use of sound equipment between the English and Spanish services.

The Latino Ministry is looking forward to the second presentation by Attorney Otis Landerholm of Landerholm Immigration, APC, on Friday, April 17, at 7:00 pm. This is a follow-up to his presentation last September that was attended by over 50 adults plus children. Immigration laws are changing rapidly, and people want current information. Flyers have been prepared and will be distributed throughout the community by members of the congregation. Cookies, drinks and childcare will be provided during the event.

Lina is aptly managing the administrative responsibilities. Pastors have been scheduled for the third Sunday of each month through June. Bulletins are prepared weekly. She and Jane Gentry in the Trinity Office are coordinating well.




