- Approved continuing to have one English Sunday service at 10:00 am. The Worship Team will re-evaluate

in August and determine if we should go to two services by "Back to Church Sunday."

Latino Ministry

Money Matters: Per Capita

Perhaps one of the most confusing aspects of how the Presbyterian Church functions is **"per-capita".** Each year our church encourages its members to pay their per-capita apportionment. Why do we do this? Where does this money go?

One of the great strengths of our denomination is that it is so interconnected. Trinity is tied to the larger church in ministry. One form of that connection is through our per-capita. Every Presbyterian church in the country is required to pay a certain amount for each active member on its rolls. This money goes to support the work and ministry of our church throughout the country. Each governing body above our Session has staff members and expenses that support the work of the church. These individuals have no congregation to support their ministry, but they are essential to the life of the Presbyterian Church.

This year Trinity's per-capita apportionment is **\$27.00** per member, which is split for the work of our General Assembly PC USA (\$7.12), the Synod of the Pacific (\$5.22), Presbytery of Sacramento (\$13.66), and the Presbytery's New Church Development Fund (\$1.00).

Many people have the misperception that per-capita is their annual "Presbyterian membership dues". Not true. Our church isn't a fraternal or service organization that dismisses members for unpaid dues. Yes, Trinity is required to pay its per-capita to the larger church. If members are unwilling or unable to pay, then the money will be taken out of our operating budget to complete our per-capita obligation. This has a negative financial impact on other church programs.

If you haven't done so already, please make out a check payable to Trinity Presbyterian Church in the amount of \$27.00 for each active church member in your household. Make a note on your check that it is to be used for per capita. Mail your check to the church office or simply put it in the offering plate on Sunday.



February Out-of-the-Box (OOTB)

February's OOTB was great as usual! Everyone enjoyed the event, even in the cold and dark. Toni offered eight large tubs of clothes, books and miscellaneous household items to give away. The food bags were full of surprise goodies, and people loaded up as much as they could carry away. Those with extra-large grocery carts were the envy of everyone.

A large number of people were on foot and had walked a long distance in bad weather. Some homeless people had come all the way from behind IKEA and Walmart, where there is a camp that is exposed to the elements and uncomfortable compared to in town. Let's hope our food and other items help them survive. Other homeless people walked from Social Services at 500 Jefferson, where they are allowed to shelter under the overhang and use the restrooms (as long as they are quiet and don't make a mess). It's only a few minutes away by car but is a sizeable walk on foot.

Another two women came by bus from Broderick near the river. They had to arrive early and wait, due to the bus schedule. Was there a bus that night or did they have to walk home? Others had bicycles. It was amazing to see how they were able to balance "so many bags" on their bikes without crashing.

It was inspiring to see how many people braved the elements, and, as always, the high point of the event was when Pastor Eric stood on the planter and spoke to us! And all God's children said, "Amen."



Out-of-the-Box Ministries

Hello Trinity family!

One of your practical local missions, **Out-ofthe-Box Ministries**, just finished packing over 150 bags of groceries for the month of March. This marks our 9th year of providing food to West Sacramento Families.

Our Mission is to Feed People Whenever Possible!

Out-of-the-Box is a food ministry that provides a bag of groceries to every local family who comes through our doors, every month of the year. **Out-of-the-Box** operates only by volunteers. All funds received go directly to buying food or supplies necessary for distributing that food.

One **Out-of-the-Box** food bag typically provides 36 individual meals.

On Average, one Out-of-the-Box Bag feeds:

One person for 12 Days with three meals a day, or

A family of four for three Days; three meals a day.

This equals 5,400 meals each month or nearly 65,000 meals over a year!

Are you interested in feeding people? Would you like to help us? So what do we need most? You!

Every month we need a small army of volunteers to make it all possible.

Can you lift a can of food, fill a bag of groceries on an assembly line, and be willing to let God use you in a way that, may even change your life? Then you qualify and are invited to join us!

I am a retired educator who enjoys reading, meeting new people, and spending time with my family.




Bible Study
