Toni Charities (TCS) is Nine Years Old

On July 26, 2014, Toni is celebrating Toni Charities' ninth anniversary. Wow! Nine years is a long time.

TCS started on July 26th, 2005, when Toni, newly arrived in Sacramento and despondent about her circumstances, took a plastic bag and went out on Second Street, where she still lives, and picked up papers and other trash. A simple start...it felt good so she kept it up every day and that lead to more and more things.

In 2014 TCS has been averaging 10 -15 large tubs of clothing and other usable items given away each month, thanks to all your wonderful donations.

Cats and Toni Charities

Toni says, "Originally I started Toni Charities to cheer myself up, and it worked so well I kept at it, and expanded it into other charitable activities as opportunities arise.

One of Toni's favorite activities is making sure homeless cats are trapped, neutered, and released. No cats are killed; they are returned to where they lived and cared for by volunteers, but she is no longer treating kittens.

Abandoned, homeless cats have multiplied rapidly in West Sacramento. Toni says, "There are more cats than people in West Sacramento!" Well, it certainly looks like that in some neighborhoods. With people constantly moving in and out, pets often get left behind. Kind-hearted people feed these unneutered animals who respond by reproducing at an alarming rate: a few cats can become 40 or 50 in an amazingly short time.

If you have multiplying, unneutered cats in your neighborhood, leave Toni a message at (916) 617-2915. She will contact an experienced volunteer trapper. No cats are killed. After they are neutered by a volunteer veterinarian, one ear is "tipped" (docked), then the cat is returned two or three days later to where it lives. If you discover wild cats in your neighborhood, a tipped ear tells you that the animal has already been neutered. Thanks in advance for helping Toni Charities control the population of homeless cats in West Sacramento.

Ed Metcalf has been making sure you have coffee to drink every Sunday but is also being called to pick up some folks for church who do not have transportation. Toni Sullivan and Richard Rivas have been good about donating snacks, Toni also helps with set up when she is able to. Many hands make light work; I would like to have enough volunteers to set up a rotation of helping one Sunday a month.

If you are new to Trinity and like working around the kitchen, this is a great way to get to know each other. Everything we do on Sunday is to honor God, and that includes making time for fellowship. Since I have been a part of the Trinity family, having the opportunity to serve God has changed my life tremendously. 
SAVE THIS DATE!!! October 11, 2014
