#### **Dirt-to-Dinner a Growing Success**

People came to Trinity on Saturday morning, May 3<sup>rd</sup>, to shop and learn. By "year two" standards, the event was a success. Several hundred vegetable plants were sold for home gardens, and people learned about the art of beekeeping, cooking what they love to grow, composting, using cisterns to conserve water (by capturing and irrigating with rainwater), raising chickens, building a mini-greenhouse, worm-composting, and how one Yolo County organic farmer makes a living while sustaining the earth according to God's plan as laid out for us in Scripture.

The objectives of Dirt-to-Dinner are to empower people, particularly

those who may not have enough to eat, to grow their own food, and to teach them how to do it in a way that is cost-effective and healthy for them and the environment. Dirt-to-Dinner planners met on May 31 with Out-of-the-Box organizers to explore the future of both ministries working together to address hunger and environmental conservation.

#### Update on the remodel of Trinity.


Everything is progressing in our remodel project. By the time you read this we hope to have completely moved into our new office and that rooms 7, 8, and 9 are nearing completion. It has taken a great deal of work and coordination by our contractor, Totlcom, Wave and our Jane to get phone lines, internet access and the copy machine all shifted to the new office. This was harder than redoing room 12. Ask Don Brooks how he liked working in the attic on the 100 degree day we had in May! It is good to have that part done.

As all remodel jobs go, we have had added costs, but not without a great deal of thought. One of the big problems for rooms 1 through 11 has been heating and cooling each one. For instance, if Pastor Eric wanted to have heat on Mondays while working, he had to also heat rooms 2,3,4,5 and 6 as well as his own room. The same is true for room 10 (childcare), in that if the heat is on for that room, then rooms 7, 8, 9, and 11 also get heated. This is true for any of our groups who meet in separate rooms at different times throughout the week. With this in mind, Buildings and Grounds decided to propose to Session that each room have its own heating and cooling unit like the new one in the new office. The cost for this is an additional \$34,000.00. If we had tried to replace our old system, the cost would have been well over \$100,000.00. We are in the process of trying to secure a PG&E rebate, as the savings with this efficient system will be substantial, as it will be with the new double-paned windows and lighting fixtures we are putting into each room.

The next phase will be the new youth room. We hope to continue right on to this part after the completion of rooms 7, 8 and 9. Our funding is still positive but will need to grow it as we put in the new heating/cooling units. A big thank you to all who have donated to this fund already. All amounts are deeply appreciated. The matching funding is now at \$18,000.00 and growing.

#### Saturday, June 14, at 6 pm


The Youth Group is going on a mission trip to San Diego this summer. This is our chance to support them. To raise funds, they will host a special dinner here at Trinity. The
