At our congregational meeting, we presented a new organizational chart for our church. Our organizational chart (or "org chart") is an attempt to show on one page how we are organized to carry out our ministries. Our new org chart (on another page) shows who is the head of our church, our leaders, and the areas that are most important to us.

To begin, Jesus Christ is the head of our church. That is why he is placed on top of the chart. Everything we do at Trinity we do in reverence to Jesus. We are led by him, his teachings, his commands, and his great commission to create disciples, baptize and teach others in his name.

The other positions; Associate Pastor, Pastor, Session and Elected Positions work together to help carry out the ministries that Jesus has called our church to do. The Associate Pastor (Tina) leads our Latino ministries, while the Senior Pastor (me, Eric) supervises the office and ministry staff. I also bring vision and leadership to our church. Tina and I work together with the Session to carry out the mission and government of the church.

New to Trinity are the Elected Positions. Historically, all Presbyterian churches elect their Clerk of Session, Treasurer and Nominating Committee representatives on a regular rotation. With respect to this historic tradition, the session and I agreed it would be wise to elect positions such as the Finance and Personnel Chairs, a Facilities Manager, and an Audio & Visual Facilitator annually. These are areas of the church that require special skills, confidentiality, and would benefit from low turnover in leadership. By having the session elect these positions we honor our representative form of government and we can place people in positions that match their gifts.

We have concentrated on six areas of ministry: Church Life, Kids, Missions & Outreach, Small Groups, Students and Worship. We don't want to be good at a lot of ministries. Why? Because good is the enemy of great. We want to be great at a few ministries. We believe these six areas are key to being a great church. We also have the resources to do them well. As we

grow in numbers and resources, we can begin to explore ways to expand. For now, we want to be great at what we do.

If you are interested in serving in one of the six areas of ministries, I would love to hear from you. You don't have to be a session member to be on one of the 6 ministry teams. Each ministry team will have a session member on it. That session member does not have to be the chair or facilitator. He or she will serve as a liaison between that team and the session. My goal is to have five people on each team. Five people who have a passion for that ministry and who want it to be great.

The goal in all of this is to create a church where people can go where their gifts are; to use those gifts to better the lives of others, to build up the fellowship and mission of the church, and most of all, to glorify and honor Jesus Christ who is the head of our church.

Buildings and Grounds Update

The office is finished, and the move into it is starting and will be completed shortly. It is wonderful to see one room about done and then turn the page and start work on the next phase. This will be to remodel rooms 7, 8 and 9, changing them into offices for Pastor Eric and Pastora Tina, and a resource room to hold all the supplies needed for our Sunday School classes, as well as other functions of the Children's Ministry. In addition, plans are also being developed to replace the flooring and ceiling in rooms 4, 5 and 6. After these rooms are finished, the final portion of this phase will be to convert rooms 1 and 2 into a new youth room.

We have estimated that this phase will cost approximately \$40,000. As many of you know, \$20,000 has been donated with the provision that the congregation will match this dollar- for-dollar. As of February 18, nearly \$11,000 has been matched! This is so appreciated, and we have high hopes the remainder of \$9,000 will be forthcoming. We have held a cafe sale of excess furniture that provided nearly \$1000 to the fund, and on May 3 we will have our Trinity Bazaar to raise more.

We invite all of you to participate with us as we continue to remodel our church and make the space more useable and accessible. Trinity is now in it's seventieth year. Let's make it ready for the next seventy!

Money Matters: Per Capita

Perhaps one of the most confusing aspects of how the Presbyterian Church functions is "per-capita." Each year our church encourages its members to pay their per-capita apportionment. Why do we do this? Where does this money go?

One of the great strengths of our denomination is that it is so interconnected. Trinity is tied to the larger church in ministry. One form of that connection is through our per-capita. Every Presbyterian church in the country is required to pay a certain amount for each active member on its rolls. This money goes to support the work and ministry of our church throughout the country. Each governing body above our Session has staff members and expenses that support the work of the church. These individuals have no congregation to support their ministry, but they are essential to the life of the Presbyterian Church.

This year Trinity's per-capita apportionment is \$25.00 per member, which is split for the work of our General Assembly PC (USA) \$7.02), the Synod of the Pacific (\$5.22), Presbytery of Sacramento (\$11.76), and the Presbytery's New Church Development Fund (\$1.00).

Many people have the misperception that per-capita is their annual "Presbyterian membership dues." Not true. Our church isn't a fraternal or service organization that will dismiss members for unpaid dues. Yes, Trinity is required to pay its per-capita to the greater church. This year's total is \$4,500.00. If members are unwilling or unable to pay, then the money will be taken out of our operating budget to complete our per-capita obligation. This has a negative financial impact on other church programs.

If you haven't done so already, please make out a check payable to Trinity Presbyterian Church in the amount of \$25.00 for each active church member in your household. Make a note on your check that it is to be used for per capita. Mail your check to the church office or simply put it in the offering plate on Sunday.
