Session Highlights

At the regular meetings of the Session on March 18, 2014, and April 15, 2014, the following reports were heard and actions taken:

- Agreed that non-church items are not to be sold on Sundays.
- Approved moving some of the Buildings and Grounds funds into the savings account until they are needed.
- Approved the wording of the new Mission Statement as follows: "The mission of Trinity Presbyterian Church is to invite people into the family of God to share the transforming love of Jesus Christ."
- Approved the Clerk's annual report to Presbytery.
- Heard a report that the technology in the café is now wireless.
- Approved starting the next phase of the church remodel on May 5th or 6th, whichever date works for the contractor.
- Elected Pat Terry as commissioner to Presbytery on May 1, 2014, at Auburn Presbyterian Church.
- Began a session study from the "Once and Future Church".

A first request for information has already come in: a query about local grief-support groups; and viola, there is a list, a whole page in the notebook. Questions anyone? We're prepared!

The Greening of Trinity

Numbers 35:33-34 states the following

³³ You shall not pollute the land in which you live; for blood pollutes the land, and no expiation can be made for the land, for the blood that is shed in it, except by the blood of the one who shed it. ³⁴ You shall not defile the land in which you live, in which I also dwell; for I the Lord dwell among the Israelites.

This is a call to action for all of us to be kind to the earth. Provided below are a few things we can do to help Trinity become green, more earth friendly and reduce costs.

Recycle as much as possible (glass, plastic and paper). Remember the Deacons accept these contributions to fund their ministry. Trash should be deposited as specified below:

- Blue trash bins are for mixed recyclables with no cash value paper (bulletins, cardboard boxes, glass jars, orange juice containers)
- The bin with the two holes on top is for recyclables with cash value (soda cans, water bottles, etc.)
- Other bins are for all disposable trash.

Bring your mug from home to use for coffee, or use a church mug, we will put some out just for you.

- To help reduce water usage at the church, we suggest you take the mug home, wash it and bring it back, but if you pile it in the sink, we will wash it!
- Encourage others to bring their mugs and use church mugs for beverages, even cold ones!


Turn off the lights, air conditioning, and fans when a room is not being used.

Voluntary Water Use Reduction Recommended

The Sacramento region had a dry winter season for the third consecutive year. The City of West Sacramento has issued a list of ways we can help reduce the amount of water we use as consumers. The list is provided below to help us be good stewards of God's precious resource, water.

Outdoor tips

- Only irrigate your landscaping as needed.
- Use a broom instead of a hose to clean driveways, sidewalks and patios.
- Repair leaks and broken sprinkler heads.
- Adjust sprinklers to avoid overspray and runoff.
- Use an automatic shut-off nose on your hose.
- Reduce each irrigation cycle by two minutes.
- Install a water-efficient drip irrigation system for trees, shrubs and flowers.
- Install a WaterSense-labeled, "Smart" irrigation controller that adjusts watering based upon weather, soil type, plant type and sun exposure.

Indoor Tips

- Take 5 minute showers instead of 10 minute showers.
- Turn off water when brushing teeth or shaving.
- Wash only full loads of clothes, and only run the dishwasher when it's full.
- Fix leaky faucets and toilets.
- Install aerators on the kitchen faucet to reduce floes to less than 1.5 gallons per minute.
- Install a high-efficiency WaterSense-labeled toilet (1.28 gallons per flush.)
- Install aerators on bathroom faucets.
