## A Chat with Dr. Tom

This month I would like to return to the way relationships really work. In psychology this is called family systems or family process with the word 'family' being defined loosely. People will hear me speak about emotional triangles. An emotional triangle is formed by any three persons or issues. It can be three people, or two people and an issue (like work, or alcohol), or even by a person (say the pastor), the congregation, and an issue like the budget, or an issue like attendance.

When any two parts of a family system become uncomfortable with one another, they will 'triangle in' or focus upon a third person, or issue, as a way of stabilizing their own relationship with one another. A person may be said to be 'triangled' if he or she gets caught in the middle as the focus of such an unresolved issue.

Typical emotional triangles found in families are mother-father-child, a parent and any two children; a parent, his or her child, and his or her own parents; a parent, a child, and a symptom in the child (doing badly in school, drugs, stealing, sexual acting out, allergies, worries about attention); one spouse, the other, and the other's dysfunction (drinking, gambling, an affair, depression).

The concept of the emotional triangle helps us remember to focus on process rather than content. This is arguably the most important of all lessons in the understanding of systems. The vast majority of people focus on content issues and ignore process. When you learn to focus on process, not content, you also learn how to hear people, and also learn how to listen for what is really important.

I know this may not make sense to some of you, but the toxicity of an issue has less to do with the content of the issue as it has to do with how the issue is handled -- process. The easy approach is to assign blame without asking how the issue came to be an issue. We blame our partners -- we blame our children -- we blame our pastors -- all the while making the colossal assumption that the one we blame is wholly responsible for the pain we may feel.

Everyone has unresolved issues in their personal lives. What is amazing is that people transfer these unresolved issues onto someone else. The power and energy that is contained within the unresolved issue is placed into an issue (or more often, onto someone) that is totally unrelated to the source of the power or energy.

Church family systems, with their various expectations, are common culprits in this transfer of unresolved energy -- and pastors often get snookered. Unresolved issues in a parishioners' personal family, or unresolved issues between factions in the congregational family, or even unresolved issues within the congregation that have been passed down in the emotional system for years, can easily be transferred onto the person of the pastor, especially if the pastor has not been trained to recognize how emotional triangles work.

The value of a systems approach is that it will redistribute the anxiety of emotional triangles by naming and taming them.


