# E-Mail\* Jesus According to Mark

There is one Jesus, one Son of God, one Messiah, one way to God, which is through him. But there are also four stories about Jesus in the Bible. Why? Is the story of his life so good it needed to be told four times? Well, it is known as the greatest story ever told!

We started a new sermon series a few weeks ago. In the past we have explored who Jesus is: his historical existence, who he claimed to be, who others claim him to be and who he is to us in our personal lives. Now I want to swim to the other side of the theological pool and discuss who he is according to Mark and compare his story with the other three gospel authors: Matthew, Luke and John. Not a deeper or more shallow end of the pool, just another side to give us a different view of the theological world we're swimming around in.

I am not looking for contradictions in the stories of Jesus. All four stories are Godbreathed and reveal who Jesus is. But imagine this: four different singers write and perform a song about Jesus. Their songs will have different styles, different melodies, rhythm, words, and may even highlight different stories about Jesus. The artists may sing about their personal experience or attempt to interpret a Scripture passage about Jesus. They will each reveal Jesus through their music in a way that God has gifted them. One might be country, another pop, and yet another easy listening, but they will all be singing about one Jesus.

This is much of what we have in the four Gospels. Four different men wrote about Jesus Christ. They wrote in their style, and they wrote from their experience, but they all write about the same Jesus.

When we share the story of Jesus with others, we often share out of our experience with him. Everyone has different experiences, but that doesn't mean there is more than one Jesus! It means we share who Jesus is with others based on how he has impacted our lives.

I'm looking forward to exploring how Mark presents Jesus. I	hope you are too

# **Session Highlights**

At the regular meeting of the Session on September 16, 2014, the following reports were heard and actions taken:

- Heard a report that the Deacons will be hosting a coat drive during the months of October and November with coats to be distributed in those months.
- Heard a report that the Children's Ministries will be sending newsletters to children about the new quarterly Sunday school program, and that a children's lending library will be available in the near future.
- Heard a report that the Buildings and Grounds Committee has completed Rooms
   7, 8, and 9; and that heating and cooling units have been installed in Rooms
   7 through
- Approved replacing an electrical panel for the building.

## **Buildings and Grounds Church Remodel Update**

We are pleased to report that rooms 7, 8 and 9 are completed, and that Pastors Tina and Eric have moved into them. The total cost for these rooms was \$21,337. In addition, rooms 7 through 11 had new individual heat and air conditioning units installed. The total cost for this was \$18,352. We appreciate ever dime and dollar you have contributed to the Building Fund, and we hope you like the improvements so far!

In late October we will meet with the contractor to get estimates to convert rooms 1 and 2 into the new Youth room and to provide new flooring, ceiling and windows for rooms 4, 5, and 6. In addition, we will put individual heat and air conditioning units in rooms 1 through 6. The savings in PG & E costs with these individual units should be substantial.

We appreciate your support and sincerely hope it will continue as we move forward on this exciting path of renewal. Any thoughts or comments are welcome and appreciated.



# **Little Lending Library Project -**

## Help a Child Become a Better Reader!

We're excited to share with you a new project to help kids improve their reading – it's called "The Little Lending Library." The idea is to have a small moveable bookcase at Trinity with a variety of books in it. There will be a sign on it that says, "Take a Book, Leave a Book, or Both."

We know that kids who read are more successful students. Research shows that there's a critical window where a child either becomes a reader or not – for life. Between the ages of 7 & 9 is when that decision is made. We want to encourage our kids to read (or be read to) for at least 20 minutes a day. To help with that, we are now collecting children's books to start our "Little Lending Library." If you have books at home that you no longer need and would like to donate to this project, please bring them to church (watch for a basket in the lounge or drop them off in the church office). Books for preschoolers - middle school students would be appropriate. (We could also use a small bookcase if anyone has one they're not using.)

# **Recycling at Other Presbyterian Churches**

Caring for Creation at Orchard Park Presbyterian Church, Indianapolis, Indiana, began with recycling. First, we started bringing our newspapers and magazines to church and received monies for our "trash." (We like those revenue generators.) Next, it was recycling soda cans and water bottles consumed at church. Then, we placed recycling bins in our kitchen and office for plastics and cardboard. And just recently, we constructed a recycling and mission center, asking the congregation to save shoes for Haiti, food for a local food pantry, corks, inkjet cartridges, cell phones, etc. Some of the recyclables generate revenue; others do not. But all of the items collected demonstrate Orchard Park's care for God's creation. <sup>2</sup>
