Turn Our Dollars into New Quarters

Our plans to remodel, renovate, and rejuvenate our church are finally going to begin. In fact the first phase, relocating the office, will have started on Nov. 21. This plan was put into action for three reasons: 1) space was not being used well, and many rooms were becoming storage areas; 2) the current office was poorly located, and visibility to the outside unmanageable;, and 3) the building is in need of new flooring, painting and windows. With this in mind, Pastor Eric called a longtime friend, Stacy McCarthy, a designer by profession, to take a look at the church. She developed a plan for us that makes smarter use of our church. This plan was presented to the congregation on Nov.10. Session has approved the plans, and now the fun begins.

Funding, always an issue, is now well on its way. The first phase will cost roughly \$17,000. This bid by contractor John Nelson of JNT, Building and Remodeling, was accepted by the Session in October. Buildings and Grounds met with five contractors in all and chose Mr. Nelson after checking his references. The good news is that we have the money to complete phase I! The next phase will involve the offices for both Pastor Eric and Pastora Tina, as well as the new youth room. This phase will cost approximately \$15,000 to \$20,000, depending on the materials chosen. Our plan continues with the preschool room makeover and then the grand finale of a new kitchen (now called a serving area) in room 11. The current kitchen is to be made into a storage area for music and worship as well as storage for the Out-of-the-Box mission program.

Our hope is that many will give their financial support for this plan. Fundraising projects are brewing as I write this to you. Our slogan will be "Turn Our Dollars into New Quarters." As we turn the corner into 2014, it is worth noting that our church will begin its 70th year. It is our hope that this project will enable us to continue on our way for another 70 years.

This is a very short version of all that has gone into the preparation of this plan. Please feel free to address your comments and questions to our Building and Grounds committee.

Out of the Box

Cookie-palooza returns this December. Here's how it works: You and 20 of your friends bake as many cookies as you can stand baking. Bring them to our December packing: December 15, 2013, 12:30 p.m.

We will take the various cookies and re-pack them, and hand out a mixed assortment of cookies to our clients. We expect to see the Girl Scouts again this month; you know how they are about cookies, so we had better be on top of our game!

Christmas is a special time to work in a Food Pantry - every year we come across acts of beauty and kindness - and we are lucky to be a part of the whole thing.

This past November, I experienced three serendipitous events, all in one week.

- 1. The 800 Students at Southport Elementary conducted a Canned Food Drive.
- 2. Forty students from the River City High School Leadership Council helped us sort canned foods and place them into bags destined for families, most of whom have children in the household.
- 3. And finally, a new Southport student, a kindergartner named Lydia, has resolved to do some of her own shopping for her canned food drive. In her father's words, she "wants to go to the store to use some of her savings to buy more food to donate to her school's food drive for Out-of-the-Box Ministries!" She had first mentioned the pizza party the class with the biggest collection will get, but when I warned her that they may not win, she said what she really wanted was to help feed "little kids who don't have enough to eat."


I am extremely thankful to participate in a Ministry that puts tons of food into the mouths of children in our community. We see so many kids come through our lines, Riverbank Elementary tells us just how important our bags are to the families with children, and if you were to deliver groceries to our chosen mobile home park, you would need to drive very slowly to avoid scooters, bikes, and games of hide-and-seek. We are lucky to have a Ministry that provides food to children. I am thankful for this.

But what about the thousands of children who provide food for kids in their own city? We send out empty paper bags to schools and they come back overfilled with groceries. We have relied on young people to deliver groceries, pack groceries, stomp cardboard in the recycle bin and man stations in our packing lines. They have performed magnificently; they have multiplied our efforts. I am humbled to think that we have created a framework for kids to express their love, and their own Thanksgivings.

So this Thanksgiving, I would like to give special thanks to the kids in our community who feed one another with excellence. If you see one of them, thank and encourage them.

Happy Thanksgiving and a Merry Christmas to each of you! Thank you for telling a forgotten community month after month: "You matter."
