In Genesis we read about The Fall; the story where Adam and Eve betray God and break their relationship with him. Ever since that moment, God has been working to make that relationship whole again.

Throughout Scripture we read about people who, through their own actions, damage their relationship with God. The Israelites complained about wandering in the wilderness even though God saved them from slavery in Egypt. David took advantage of his position as king of Jerusalem and, for a moment, seemed to forget that God anointed him to be the king in the first place. When Jesus was arrested, Peter denied knowing him to avoid being associated with him. Yet, God promised the Israelites he would always be their God. God acknowledged David as a man after his own heart and forgave him his shortcomings. Jesus met with Peter after the resurrection and, despite his temporary weakness, Jesus asked Peter to take care of his sheep.

The Bible contains story after story of people falling. And it seems that every time someone falls, God is there to catch them.

We, like the characters in the Bible, fall. But if we choose to, we can fall in a new kind of way.

God is there to catch us. Why not fall into his hands? We can have a new kind of fall. The first one is The Fall. But today, let's have a Fall Back.

Fall Back into the arms of God. Let him catch you. God's there. He has promised a future for you. And if you let him catch you when you trip, he can help set you on your feet again. But before you can stand tall, you have to be willing to Fall Back.

Call-Em-All

If you have ever had a reverse 911 call you are aware of the technology that exists that allows you to receive automated calls within a specified geographical area. Trinity Presbyterian Church is using a service *Call-Em-All* that works similarly to reverse 911. The service allows the church office administrator to record a message and send it, via telephone, to you. Messages can be sent to remind you of upcoming activities, events, and meetings (e.g. session meeting reminder to session members). Urgent messages can also be sent, such as the death of a Trinity family member and memorial service information. Messages will be limited to reminders of special services such as Christmas services. You will not be bombarded with weekly messages.

A database has been built with either your home or cellular telephone number, and you can expect to receive an occasional message from Trinity. If you wish to opt out and not receive <u>any</u> messages, please call the church office to be removed from the database. Additionally, if you wish to receive text messages <u>only</u>, you can call the church office and opt in to the text message only option.
