

#### HOLD THAT DOOR!

#### Pastor Eric's E-Mail



The other day I stopped at a local store to grab a few things. As I walked out, a family of four was walking in. I held the door. First the two young boys walked in. They were about 9 and 11 years old. They didn't say anything. They didn't even look at me. They just walked past as if I wasn't there. "Well, that's just kids," I thought. Their parents will say something.

Then the dad walked by. Literally. After him came mom. She was the only one

who made eye contact, but no words. No thank you, no head nod, not even a smile.

This kind of behavior drives me mad. What happened to saying, "Thank you?"

I could use this as an opportunity to discuss the need for common courtesy, but that is a symptom of the problem, not the root. I think the real issue is a failure to live up to Proverbs 22:6:

Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old, they will not turn from it. (NIV)

I was tempted to say something, but I didn't. I simply walked to my truck. Besides, I felt like the Holy Spirit was reminding me of another verse:

Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you. (NIV)

Common courtesy doesn't require someone being kind to you. It exists because people choose to use it regardless of how they themselves are treated. It exists because people have been forgiven by God in Christ, and we model God's forgiveness toward us in the way we treat others.

Live as if you are forgiven, because you are...completely.

And if you see someone walking in a door that you have just walked out, hold the door for them. It doesn't matter whether or not you think they will say thank you. It symbolizes

God is holding the door to His home open for you.

#### **Mercy Coalition Update**


