Out of the Box

September was a busy month for Out of the Box! A new school year means that we have the privilege in this life to deliver bags of groceries to families with school-age children. This is cause enough for celebration, but this story gets a little weird. We contacted Riverbank Elementary School to re-establish our grocery distribution there. Riverbank is a larger school than Bryte, so we asked Principal Mike Woodcock if he could use a few extra bags, (we had previously delivered 60 per month). His answer?

"Our families could definitely use your support. It is amazing what you do for this community. Riverbank now has close to 800 students. Over 90% of them qualify for free lunch. We would be grateful for any support you can give."

This is what is known as a "reality check". Out of the Box creates 200 bags per month total! This 720 number for just one school is preposterous, outrageous, impossible, and unrealistic...a non-starter. And we would be perfectly within our rights to politely let the school know that this is impossible for us to fulfill. Or, we can try, with no real hope of success. Do you want to know what happened when we chose the latter?

I received a phone call from Don Bosley, Pastor of Lighthouse Covenant Church and a longtime friend of Trinity. Don is/was seeking creative ways for churches to make a positive impact in our community. We told him about Riverbank, and just like that, Lighthouse was in! They will make bags, bring them to church on the 2nd Sunday, and then bring them over to Trinity for delivery. As a guideline, we sent a sample list of "what goes in a bag". One of these fliers landed in the hands of Curves of West Sacramento, and they joined in. A few days later, the Grocery Outlet of West Sacramento called; could we use all 80 bags of groceries their customers had provided? And just like that, our 60 bags grew to 180 bags – just for the school, because we agreed to try. We did not have to break our backs, canvas neighborhoods, wash cars, or worst of all, form a committee. We had to try, and we had to ask, after that the Holy Spirit kicked in and turned our pantry into a cornucopia.

We need your help this month:

If you would like to try "each person bring a bag" at your favorite organization, let me know. If you have another church in mind, let me know. Feeding people is easier than you think and more rewarding than you can guess. Together we're feeding West Sacramento one family at a time!

DEACON RECYCLING CONTINUES!



Money Matters: Budget Update

Two months ago I wrote a Newsletter article about our fiscal-year budget. We are three months into that new budget cycle. Since the budget was established we now know Eric Keller will be our new head pastor beginning January 1st. Eric's arrival will have a significant impact on our budget. Following are highlights of three months of actual income and expenses compared to our budget:

- Income Less Than Projected: Income is down almost \$1,400 a month from our projections. We are very optimistic Pastor Eric will have a positive influence on reversing that trend.
- Session Reorganization: Every line item in the budget is now clearly tied to the Session member responsible for it.
- New Head Pastor: Pastor Eric's compensation package is a little over \$7,000 a month. It includes his salary, housing allowance, deferred compensation, SECA (Self-Employment Compensation Act), HRA (Health Reimbursement Arrangement), medical coverage, pension, travel/professional expense, and continuing education. We budgeted \$5,000 per month because we didn't know when our new Pastor would begin his ministry. Right now we are saving about \$3,800 a month on pastor compensation. Starting January 1st we will be paying \$2,000 more a month than we had budgeted.
- Associate Pastor of Latino Ministries: Pastora Tina came to Trinity in part due to a five-year grant from the Presbytery. The Presbytery pays for the majority of Pastora Tina's compensation, with Trinity paying the balance. Trinity's share has increased by \$500 per year the past three years. Our obligation for 2013 increases to \$2,000 per month. The grant ends at the end of 2013. We plan to work with the Presbytery next year to develop a financial solution that works for Tina, Trinity and the Presbytery.
- Latino Ministries Expense: Expenses related to our Latino ministries are not currently paid out of our budget, but rather out of a special fund. Next year we will augment the budget to include a line item for Latino ministries expense.
- **Reserve:** Despite falling short of our income projections, we have increased our reserves by \$4,400 per month, primarily by not having a full-time pastor. All that changes on January 1st. Instead of generating a monthly surplus we will be looking at a \$4,000-a-month deficit unless our revenue increases. We can get by for a few months by drawing on our reserves, but this would not be sustainable for the long run.

This is a very exciting time at Trinity. We face many challenges, but we also have many new opportunities. We look forward to all the wondrous things God will bring us next year! Following is a two-page budget summary for the past three months.
