The journey begins ... Part 2

In 1947, the church had secured its first resident pastor in the Rev. Joe Broadley, and its first plot of land. At the corner of West Acre and Evergreen, the church erected its first distinctive landmark.

It became known as "the Quonset hut" but in truth it was a prefabricated G.I. chapel purchased from Beale Air Force Base after the war. Volunteers from the congregation spent months putting the structure together. Even Joe Broadley, who was still finishing his graduate seminary work in the Bay Area, would drive up with his family each weekend, help with the construction of the building on Saturday, and preach to the congregation on Sunday.

"None of them knew too much about building," says Jean Broadley, Joe's wife. "There was one man who was a carpenter. It took everybody volunteering, but it worked because of the cooperation and everybody wanting it so badly at the time."

Space-wise, the G.I. chapel was definitely lacking. Personality-wise, it definitely wasn't.

"Every time you walked across it, it sounded like thunder," Fay Burgess says. "We made drapes to pull between us and the Sunday School., and every once in awhile you'd see alittle hand creep under the curtain, or a head."

Small, noisy and, by all accounts, not terribly pretty, the G.I. chapel nevertheless be-

came a cherished underdog of a home. Numerous structural deficiencies were its beauty marks.

"When it rained, we all moved our chairs, because the roof leaked like a sieve," says Evelyn Rose.

"And in the summertime, you absolutely died. It was like an oven in there."



Sunday School begins a new curriculum: Feasting on the Word

Time for a change! We are thankful for the years that our previous program, *Growing in Grace and Gratitude*, has served us. Now it is time for an update. Like our previous program, *Feasting on the Word* is published by our PC(USA) denomination. Also like our previous program, it is based on the Revised Common Lectionary, which means that



it follows a 3-year cycle of scripture readings, and covers most of the Bible in those 3 years. This set pattern of Bible stories gives our teachers structure and framework, so we don't have to "reinvent the wheel" with each lesson we teach. Our new program will:

- Introduce biblical stories in new and creative ways.
- Gather our class with age-appropriate learning activities.
- Challenge our learners to put their faith into action and grow in their self-understanding as Christians.
- Prepare our learners for the worship and service of God.


