The journey begins ... Part 3

In 1949, West Acres Presbyterian had seen its membership swell to 83. The church had also seen the blueprints for Interstate 80, and it didn't look good.

The new freeway was going to sit less than 100 feet from the church's location, which didn't bode well for the shaky G.I. chapel or any building that would follow it. With that in mind, the present plot of land at 1500 Park Blvd. was purchased, and a serious drive began to raise money for a permanent structure.

The brochure mailed from Joe Broadley's office including artist's conceptions of what the new church would look like, and also a proposed blueprint. The present sanctuary was originally designed to be a small side chapel, with the real sanctuary—featuring seating for 320—scheduled to be built at a later stage. The plans also called for classrooms, a sizable fellowship hall, a tower, a bride's room and a ladies' parlor, all encircling a garden court.

A good many of these features never quite materialized, of course, but the church did manage to raise enough funds for the initial stage of construction. Ground was broken at the Park Blvd. location on April 6, 1952—just weeks before Rev. Broadley had to leave for a stint as Navy chaplain.

Dr. Peter Bercovitz had taken over as pastor by the time the new building became inhabitable. The church's new home consisted of the present sanctuary, a pastor's study, a kitchen, two classrooms and two restrooms.

Edith Harrison, a soprano in the choir, is generally credited with submitting the name "Trinity" for the church. In March of 1955, her suggestion became reality with the dedication of the new building.

The bulk of the old G.I. chapel still stands, used as a storage shed by the Washington Unified School District.


