Confirmation Retreat Weekend This is what you are all wondering about, right? Here it is:


I would like to offer our students an opportunity to dive deeper into our Christian faith. At youth group, and even on Sunday mornings, we keep the discussion pretty light (God loves you. Be good to people.) This retreat will be a chance to really explore what we believe as Presbyterians in the PC(USA) denomination, and really give students a chance to wrestle with the ideas and think about what they believe.



We will not force anything upon the students, but we will expose them to some deeper questions, and give them space to ponder, study Scripture, and ask questions. This will not be the standard "Confirmation" class that you may have experienced as a kid in a Protestant or Catholic church. It also will not necessarily culminate in all students professing faith in front of the church, getting baptized, or becoming members of Trinity's congregation. The focus of this program is to inspire students to become followers (disciples) of Jesus, to strengthen their identity as God's special creation, to explore their God-given gifts, and to challenge them to look at the world with more compassion and generosity. We will also pair them with an adult mentor from the church who will continue to meet with them over the coming year, build relationship, and encourage them in their faith. We'll be using a curriculum called *Changing the World, Confirmation for the Missional Church.* You can find out a little about this program here: https://pres-outlook.org/product/changing-the-world-confirmation-for-the-missional-church/.

Logistics for the Confirmation Retreat: We will rent a vacation house (or 2?) at Zephyr Point Conference Center for the weekend of January 24-26, 2025. We will spend the weekend studying together, preparing meals and eating together, and enjoying the beautiful lake in winter. There may be snow, we never know, right? We have at least three adults committed to the weekend to help with the teaching, driving, and feeding of our kids. The vacation houses at Zephyr are affordable, not extravagant, so I am confident that we can keep the cost affordable for families. As always at Trinity, we will never let money hold a student back from attending something they want to do.

Interest RSVP: Please let me know very soon if your student is interested in participating. This is not a money-down commitment, I just need an idea of how many people are interested so I can get the accommodations reserved. Then I'll be able to calculate the cost per student. I am also opening this up to other youth groups in our area to see who want to join us.

Presbyterian Youth Triennium

Triennium is back! After a 6-year hiatus, our denomination is ready to wel-

come back thousands of high school aged youth and their adult leaders to Louisville, Kentucky, for four days of worship, recreation, Bible study, outreach, and faith formation. This will happen July 28-31, 2025. It is open to all youth, incoming 9th graders though outgoing 12th-graders. Our local presbytery is excited to send a delegation from California. Our teens have the opportunity to join other local youth, and to meet kids from all over the country!

The journey begins ... Part 5

Christianity and the world at large were launching into some important transitions in 1963, the year Rev. Archie Marston succeeded Rev. Telle as pastor at Trinity.

Among these changes was a gradual shift in philosophy among individual denominations. In West Sacramento, as elsewhere, churches of differing ideologies were finding ways to team up in their mission.

"I remember that Father Fray of the Catholic Church came to preach at Trinity," says Rev. Marston. "At the same time I was invited to come preach at Our Lady of Grace church, which was very historical.

"Myself and Father Murphy, a young Irish priest, went to the high school and put on classes together on Christian faith and values. That was kind of unheard of."


The ecumenical emphasis extended to the use of Trinity's facilities. A Seventh-Day Adventist group asked and was granted permission to meet at Trinity. Later, the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints did likewise for a time.

"The Church has been so fractured, and we still are," Rev. Marston says. "But I do think there was a certain amount of healing at that time. There was a sense that we really did belong together, as brothers and sisters of Christ."

We need your help!


Sign up to bring treats for after our Sunday service. There will be a signup in the Narthex and you will receive a reminder call during the week.
