
Please join us on Friday, April 18th at 7:00 p.m. For a very moving Good Friday service, as we reflect on the events of the Crucifixion.



During this time of Lent, we celebrate that God connects with us through Jesus' resurrection and connects us with "those who have least" and that's what OGHS is all about. We are there with those who experience need, loss or lack in a world of disaster, hunger, and oppression.

The three programs supported by One Great Hour of Sharing - Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program, and Self-Development of People - all work in different ways to serve the millions of people who lack access to sustainable food sources, clean water, sanitation, education, and opportunity. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, the work of our programs fit together to provide people with safety, sustenance, and hope.

We are always in need of adults to help facilitate our youth events. Please prayerfully consider how you might be able to help us provide a safe, loving, fun environment for our teens to hang out.




