(based on Matthew 21: 1-11)




(based on Matthew 21: 1-11)

Use one or more activities from each section to explore grace and gratitude with your children this week.

Recognizing God's Grace

- Read and enjoy the story with your family members—imagine and wonder.
- Jesus and the disciples usually walked wherever they went. Wonder together what it means that Jesus asked the disciples to go get the donkey.
- ➤ A cloak is like an outer garment, a coat or long vest. Wonder together why the crowd spread their cloaks on the road for the donkey carrying Jesus to walk on. Wonder together why they cut branches from the trees.



Responding to God's Grace

- What do you do when you're glad someone has arrived? Imagine that the people in the story used your ideas to show their excitement.
- Hosanna means "save us" or "help us." What are some words you use when you want to express "help us"?
- ► Invite your family members to tell about a special celebration in their lives.

Celebrating in Gratitude

- If your church has palms today in worship, be ready to wave the palms and remember how glad people were to see Jesus.
- Save a palm branch and make a cross from a frond. Do an internet search for "Making a cross from a palm branch."
- This is the beginning of Holy Week. Attend a Holy Week service at your church or in your community: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, or Saturday Easter Vigil.
- Make a Holy Week box (bit.ly/HolyWeekBox) for your family to remember the events of Holy Week.
- Pray this prayer each day this week:


Ride on, King Jesus! No one can hinder you. Ride on! Amen.

I will tell the truth.




Jesus prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane.
